Leticia **Pact**

Signed on September 6th, 2019 as a result of the Presidential Summit for the Amazon

The Leticia Pact seeks the integration of the countries that share the Amazon biome.

Its objectives include:

- Generate joint responses to disasters that may occur in any country.
- Strengthen regional action to address pressures such as deforestation, selective logging and illegal mining.
- Advance in the generation of scientific knowledge to make the best decisions for the protection of the Amazon.

ACTION PLAN

Launched in the framework of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP25) in December 2019.

It contains 16 mandates and 52 actions.

PACT MANDATES

- 1. Strengthen coordinated action for the valuation of forests and biodiversity; combat deforestation and forest degradation.
- 2. Establish mechanisms for cooperation and information exchange to fight against illegal activities.
- 3. Create the Amazon Cooperation Network for natural disasters to coordinate and articulate the national systems for disaster prevention and response.
- 4. Exchange and implement experiences in comprehensive fire management.
- 5. Implement restoration, rehabilitation and accelerated reforestation initiatives in areas degraded by forest fires and illegal activities.
- 6. Increase efforts associated with the monitoring of forests and other ecosystems in order to have periodic reports.
- 7. Exchange information to improve the region's capacity to monitor climate, biodiversity, water and hydrobiological resources.
- 8. Promote initiatives for the connectivity of priority ecosystems and protection figures for the conservation of biodiversity.
- 9. Exchange and implement experiences in the comprehensive management of protected area systems at the regional, national and subnational levels for their effective management and for the benefit of local populations.
- 10. Strengthen mechanisms that support and promote sustainable forest use, sustainable production systems, and responsible production and consumption patterns.
- 11. Promote joint actions aimed at the **empowerment of women** living in the Amazon region.
- 12. Strengthen the capacities and participation of indigenous and tribal peoples and local communities in the sustainable development of the Amazon.
- 13. To promote research, technological development, technology transfer and knowledge management processes in order to guide appropriate decision making and promote the development of entrepreneurships.
- 14. Develop and articulate among Amazonian countries education and awareness-raising activities on the role and function of the Amazon, to strengthen the resilience of Amazonian populations.
- 15. To work together to strengthen financial programs and mechanisms, to vindicate the commitments assumed in these spaces, and to mobilize public and private resources for the implementation of this Pact.
- 16. Make rapid progress in the formulation of the second phase of the Sustainable Landscapes of the Amazon Program with the Global Environment Facility.
